

OVERVIEW:

The use of a floor hoist is recommended for this installation. If you do not have access to one, use a hydraulic floor jack and jack stands to raise the vehicle.








REMOVAL INSTRUCTIONS:

STEP 1: Position vehicle on hoist, put in park. Lubricate all isolators (6).

STEP 2: Loosen the 2 clamps over the rear axle. Unlock the locating tabs and slide the clamps forward.



STEP 3: Remove the screw from each rear isolators from the frame. Slide free.







STEP 4: Remove the 2 screws from the LH and RH isolator attached to the side of the frame between the tips and rear axle. Save the hardware.





STEP 5: Work the tailpipes out of the expanded muffler outlets and around the spare tire. Pull off the isolators to use with the new exhaust.








STEP 6: Remove the 2 bolts from the front flange. Save for reinstallation.



STEP 7: Slide the assembly backwards to remove the hangers from the isolators, then tilt down and remove forward.



INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS:

STEP 1: Place the front muffler assembly over the crossmember and attach to the flange using the factory bolts removed before. Do not tighten.



STEP 2: Slide a clamp over the expanded inlet of the intermediate pipe. Slide the assembly over the front muffler assembly outlet and push the hanger into the rubber isolator.





Step 3: Slide a clamp over the expanded inlet of the y-pipe or muffler assembly. Slide onto the intermediate pipe and push the hanger into the rubber isolator.




Step 4: Slide a clamp over the inlet of the RH tailpipe, and slide the tailpipe over the overaxle pipe. Then slide the isolators onto the hangers. Attach the isolators to the frame using the factory bolts. Do not tighten the clamp.








Step 5: Slide a clamp over the expanded inlet of the crossover pipe and slide onto the overaxle pipe. Do not tighten the clamp.





Step 6: Slide a clamp over the inlet of the LH tailpipe, and slide the tailpipe over the crossover pipe. Then slide the isolators onto the hangers. Attach the isolators to the frame using the factory bolts. Do not tighten the clamp.









STEP 7: Check your exhaust system for proper clearance. Tips should be centered in the cutouts and minimum of 13mm from the bumper. Under the vehicle should be a minimum of 25 mm to any part of the vehicle. tighten the clamps to 35 ft-lbs (48 Nm), the flange bolts to 30 ft-lbs (40 Nm), and the isolators to 25 ft-lbs (34 Nm), checking tip alignment and clearances as you do.



STEP 8: Start vehicle and check for any leaks. If any leaks are found, determine cause (such as loose or incorrectly positioned clamp) and repair as necessary.

Note: When you first start your vehicle after the installation of your new Ford Performance Parts Exhaust System, there may be some smoke and fumes coming from the system. This is a protective water based coating used in the manufacturing of mandrel bent performance exhaust tubing. This is not a problem and will disappear within a very short period of time after the exhaust has reached operating temperatures.
